

1 3. That CASA staff and volunteers may review any juvenile dependency or delinquency
2 court file and attend any juvenile court to complete foster care file reviews at the
3 direction of CASA staff, unless otherwise directed by the court;


4 4. That CASA staff or volunteers may review any juvenile court file to evaluate the
5 minor's progress towards attaining a permanent home and/or evaluate the need for
6 services of the CASA program, unless otherwise directed by the court;

7 5. In connection with evaluating the minor's progress toward attaining a permanent
8 home, CASA staff and volunteers may contact any person who may have knowledge of
9 the appropriate permanent plan for the minor, as shown by the file or as recommended or
10 identified by any party. Such information is to be treated confidentially and
11 communicated to this court and counsel for the purpose of assisting the court in
12 establishing an appropriate plan for the minor.

13 6. That the Department of Social Services shall share information with CASA regarding
14 the minor's process toward placement in a permanent home.

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17 This order shall remain in full force and effect until further order of this court.
