) RELEASE OF JUVENILE COURT RECORDS  
) TO PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES  
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State and federal public policies support a right for all children placed in foster care and shelters to receive appropriate health services. (*Welf. & Inst. Code* § 16001.9(a)(4); 42 U.S.C. §622(b)(15). When a child is declared a dependent child of the court, the court authorizes County of Riverside, by and through its Department of Public Social Services (DPSS), to provide medical, dental, surgical and mental health care as required for foster children.

Pursuant to *Welf. & Inst.* § 827, subdivision (K), “[p]ersons. . .providing treatment or supervision of the minor” and subdivision (Q), “[a]ny other person who may be designated by court order of the judge of the juvenile court upon filing a petition” are authorized to review the juvenile court case file.

Pursuant to *Welf. & Inst. Code* Section 369, subdivision (e), in any case in which the court has ordered the performance of any medical, surgical, dental, or other remedial care as set forth in this Section, the court may also make an order authorizing the release of information concerning that care to a qualified individual or agency caring for or acting in the interest of the child.

1 Public Health Nurses help individuals and families prevent illness and maintain and achieve good  
2 health. Public Health Nursing Services and programs include home visits with pregnant/parenting moms,  
3 their babies, high risk infants and children, other family members, including adults and seniors. Public  
4 Health Nurses also collaborate with Department of Public Social Services for follow-up with infants and  
5 children at risk of child abuse/neglect and also follow up with children placed in foster care homes.

6 Public Health Nurses are responsible for monitoring the status of mental health issues by and  
7 through review of Judicial Counsel Form JV-220, and entering psychotropic medication data into the  
8 Health and Education Passport. They are also responsible for entering data into the Health and Education  
9 Passport following assessments of the health status of foster children, in general, as well as foster children  
10 designated as medically fragile.

11 To further the goal that all children in placement receive appropriate health care services, the court  
12 hereby issues a standing order authorizing Public Health Nurses to review medically-related records  
13 contained within juvenile court files and/or electronic records.
